## New Library Update

As you have probably noticed, we are still not quite moved in. We ran into quite a few delays in the last months before we came back to High St. Due to supply chain issues with steel, there were some very long delays in getting our shelving. Happily, most of the second floor shelving will be delivered the first week of March. If the shipment is complete, Youth Services will have all their shelves by mid-March. Phew. We are still waiting on some pieces for the first floor. All of our children's and teen collections have been brought out of storage. About a third of the adult collection is still offsite, but we expect to have everything back and reshelfed in early March. Once we have all our books and shelves we will get signage up and make some maps so you can find things!

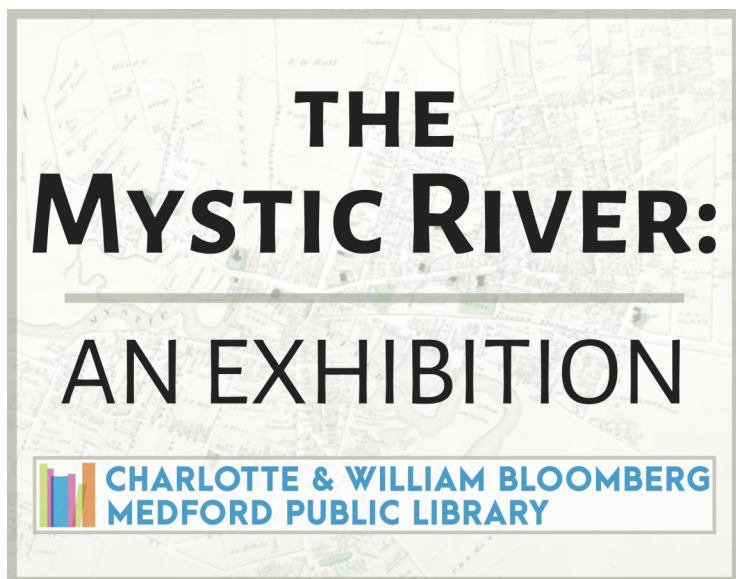
It has been slow going with our tech systems as well. However, wireless and public internet PCs and Macs are up and running. We will be debuting a new networked printing system by the end of the March. In the meantime, printers are attached to the public PCs. You may see tv screens around the building and in the study rooms. Some of these will be digital signage and others will be for use by patrons and programs. These will be up and running after staff training in March. The tech lab is still a work in progress but we expect to begin offering programs in the space in May. We have a brand laptop dispenser that will be in operation the week of March 7. The dispenser is located by the Reference Desk. With your library card you can check out a PC or Mac laptop for two hours. Laptops can only be used in the building.




## EZEKIEL'S WHEELS KLEZMER BAND

## WOLFGANG AMADEUS MOZART: *The Man Behind The Music*

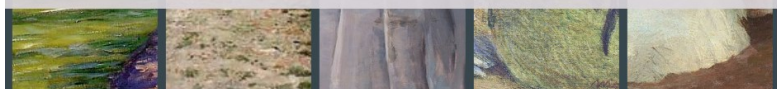

## Sacco & Vanzetti: Murderers Or Martyrs?

Accused of a 1920 South Braintree robbery, during which two men were murdered in cold blood, Nicola Sacco and Bartolomeo Vanzetti were convicted and sentenced to death. But did evidence support their convictions "beyond a reasonable doubt?" Or were they "convicted" simply because they were Italian immigrants — and anarchists? The Sacco and Vanzetti case became an international cause célèbre, igniting massive demonstrations, splitting families apart, and to some, staining Massachusetts justice forever.

Led by Gregory Williams, who was a District Court judge for many years, retiring as the First Justice of the Edgartown District Court on the Cape in 2015.

## THE HUNT FOR ENDANGERED APPLES

with historian and author Sarah Lohman

Apples have been called the country's "most endangered food." Currently, 86% of apple varieties grown in the US have vanished, and four out of five are on the brink of extinction. During Prohibition, apple trees were cut down by supporters of the Temperance movement as a showy conquest over America's alcoholic heritage. Often bumpy, brown, and tannic these apples didn't have the appeal to succeed in a modern grocery store.



But thanks to the hard cider revival, rare apples are being saved. In this class, we'll explore the historical characters that brought good cider to America and the contemporary cider makers who hope to preserve these apples. I'll also share my travels across the country on the hunt for rare apples, including a once famous New Jersey apple that was considered extinct until its 2018 rediscovery in an abandoned 19th century orchard.



Sarah Lohman is a culinary historian and the author of the bestselling book *Eight Flavors: The Untold Story of American Cuisine*. She focuses on the history of food as a way to access the stories of diverse Americans. Her work has been featured in *The Wall Street Journal*, *The New York Times*, and NPR. Her current project, *Endangered Eating: Exploring America's Vanishing Cuisine* will be released in January, 2023.

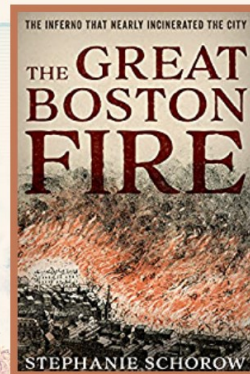
## Inside The Great Boston Fire

150 years ago, for two days in November 1872, a massive fire swept through Boston, leaving the downtown in ruins and the population traumatized. Coming barely a year after the infamous Chicago fire, Boston's inferno turned out to be one of the most expensive fires per acre in U.S. history. Yet today few are aware of how close Boston came to destruction.

Boston author Stephanie Schorow will recount the fire's history from the foolish decisions that precipitated it to the heroics of firefighters who fought it. Experience the drama of a life-and-death battle in the heart of the city.

Stephanie Schorow is a veteran journalist who has worked for the *Boston Herald*, the *Associated Press*, and other media. Her previous books include *"Inside the Combat Zone: The Stripped Down Story of Boston's Most Notorious Neighborhood," "Drinking Boston: A History of the City and its Spirits," "Boston on Fire: A History of Fires and Firefighting in Boston,"* and *"The Coconut Grove Fire."*
