# Transgender 101 with Nikk Cochran Selik Thursday, June 9 at 7:00 p.m.





Back in 1875, Thatcher Magoun, Jr. presented Medford an amazing gift, his father's High Street mansion, which became our first Library.

Nearby residents such as Samuel C. Lawrence, proprietor of Medford Rum, and Rev. Henry C. DeLong of the Unitarian Church, served as Trustees. Librarian Mary E. Sargent reached out to the community, especially children.

Amid all this success, however, Margaret O'Hare, Thatcher's adopted daughter who lived across the street, was embroiled in legal battles with Magoun relations.


