
Lost Towns of the Swift River Valley: Drowned by the Quabbin with Elena Palladino

In April 1938, Swift River Valley residents held a farewell ball to mark the demise of the quintessential New England town of Enfield and its three smaller neighbors, Greenwich, Dana, and Prescott as the Commonwealth of Massachusetts sacrificed these three towns to build the Quabbin, a massive reservoir of drinking water for residents of Boston.

Author and historian Elena Palladino recounts the story of these communities through eyes of those who lived there until the end.


Dropkick Murphy: A Legendary Life with Emily Sweeney

This book chronicles for the first time the unbelievable life of Dr. John "Dropkick" Murphy, a professional wrestler who put himself through medical school during the Great Depression and then opened Bellows Farm, a one-of-a-kind institution that served as both a facility where elite athletes could train as well as a secluded place where down-on-their-luck alcoholics could go to sober up discreetly.

Drawing on years of research and interviews, author Emily Sweeney goes behind the scenes to reveal the untold story of Murphy's life, his farm, and the legendary events that unfolded there.


