There will be a lot of other kids wanting to do it too, so I'll have to practice being patient and waiting my turn. If I'm worried about getting hurt, I can ask a grownup for help.


BEHIND THE INFO DESK: FACE PAINTING





UPPER LOBBY: SCAVENGER HUNT PICKUP/DROPOFF



One of the activities I can participate in is a scavenger hunt! I can pick up the instructions in the lobby. I can take my time finding answers to clues with my grownup(s) to solve a riddle. If I solve the riddle, I will bring the completed form back here to win a prize!

CHILDREN'S ROOM: SWORD FIGHTING

TEEN ROOM: LIFE SIZE CANDY LAND





In the Teen Room, I can play a life size version of the board game Candy Land! Instead of moving a piece around the board, I can BE the piece! There will be grownups and teen volunteers who will explain how it works. I might have to wait for a turn, but I can practice being patient.

YOUTH SERVICES PROGRAM ROOM: BOOKMARK CRAFT





In the youth services program room, I can make a silly bookmark to take home with me. There will be plenty of supplies for everyone to make one. There will be a librarian leading the craft if I need help.

BONSIGNORE HALL: DANCE PARTY



From 2-3 pm, there will be dance party in Bonsignore Hall! There will be a lot of kid-friendly music to move my body to. The music will be loud, and the kids dancing will be excited and probably loud too. If I want to just listen and watch, even from outside the room, that's ok!

QUIET ROOM: SENSORY-FRIENDLY SPACE



The Fairy Tale Ball is an event that is going to have a lot of people and will get loud and likely overwhelming. If I need a place to go to that's quieter to calm my body and my mind, I can go to the quiet room. It will be a special sensory friendly space for kids like me who need a break. I can stay here for as short or as long as I want.

SENSORY SPACE LIBRARIAN

The Sensory Storytime librarian, Maddi, who usually looks like this photo above, is going to be dressed up like Rosalina from the Mario games. She will be the librarian in the quiet room/sensory-friendly space for the day.



In the quiet room, I can: color in coloring books, cuddle a stuffed animal, play with some toys, read a book, play with fidgets, do a calming breathing exercise, or just sit and relax. I can also get a special vest that feels like a hug, or some headphones to make everything quieter.
