This revealing and informative book by Jason Reynolds is meant to open discussions regarding race beyond conflict. It is especially targeted at informing teenagers on the complexity of racism. From the beginnings of institutionalized racism to the many ways it was justified, and how it is present today, the book is very useful as a tool to understanding what racism is, and how to combat it.

The book does a good job of breaking down a very controversial issue such as racism, in rudimental way for teens to understand and wrap their heads around. It dumbs down the main issues, explains the origins and causes, and details how it is visible today. While it may not be a captivating tale like a Harry Potter per se, it does a great job of putting an issue such as racism into the minds of teens in a way that they can use this education to make a change.
