Our FY25 stats are in!

Last year Medford Library was open for 3204 service hours. In that time, we had 229,218 visits! Folks checked out 669,522 items from the library's collection of books, movies, magazines, ebooks, and, yes, sometimes even air fryers and ukuleles. And you asked questions! We had over 43,000 reference questions asked and answered.

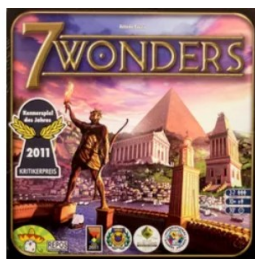


### November: Adele Travisano

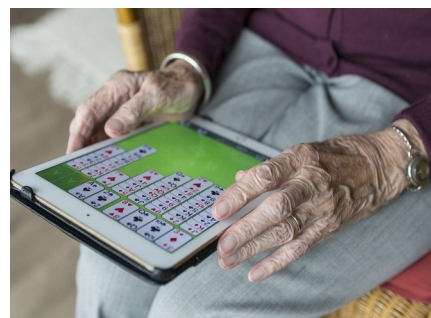

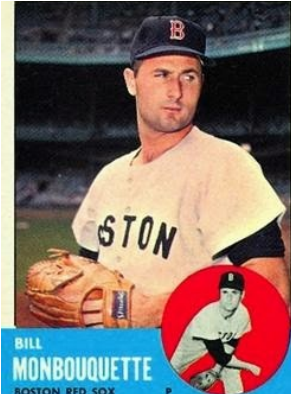

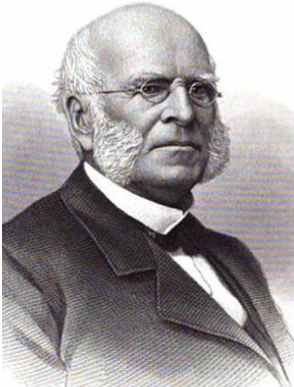


## Bill Monbouquette: One of a kind!

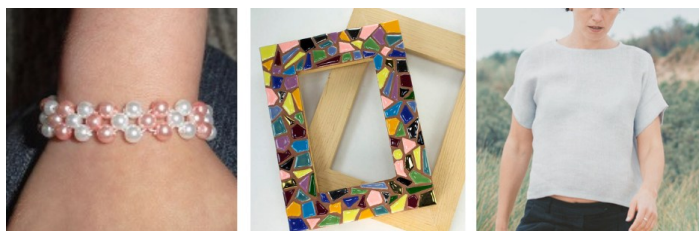
