






Fantasy Recommendation:

In Naomi Novik's first book in the Scholomance Trilogy, A Deadly Education, students at the deadly magic school must survive constant monster attacks without teachers, with graduation being their only way out. The sarcastic protagonist, Galadriel "El" Higgins, has a magical affinity for mass destruction but fights against using her power. Great as an audiobook as well! -Jenna B.

Non Fiction Recommendation:

David Grann's The Wager recounts the true story of a British naval ship that wrecked off the coast of Patagonia in the 1740s while on a secret mission. The book details the crew's harrowing survival on a remote island, their descent into chaos and murder, and the explosive court-martial that followed after conflicting groups of survivors returned home with wildly different versions of what occurred. -Sam S.






Teen Recommendation:

What happens when a people pleaser accidentally reveals what she's truly feeling? In Ann Liang's I Hope This Doesn't Find You, Sadie Wen unleashes all of her pent up rage in hate emails that she keeps in her drafts folder. But when the drafts accidentally find their way to their intended recipients, Sadie's world is turned upside down. She quickly needs to find ways to make amends with her classmates, the boy she's sworn to always hate, and, most importantly, herself. If you love the enemies to lovers trope and Jenny Han's To All the Boys I've Loved Before, this book is for you! -Nicole P.

Children's Recommendation:

No Cats in the Library is a charming authorial debut from illustrator Lauren Emmons. Our hero is a little cat who LOVES books, even if she doesn't know what to make of the black squiggles that accompany the pictures. When she discovers a magical place where people come out with armloads of books, she knows she has to get inside. There's one problem: there are NO CATS allowed in the library! With cozy orange and teal illustrations, this picturebook is sure to become a favorite of cat lovers and library lovers alike. 

ArtsMedford nurtures creativity, supports artists and the arts, and works to reflect the diverse community of Medford.


