Postscript by Cory McCarthy is a beautiful tale about the importance of humanity, even after its collapse. Humanity permeates through instinct, anthropic propensity that the book emphasizes as vital to the human condition, and in the end, the characters learn that even at the ends of humanity, that they can still cling to the hope the lies in human connection and relationships, acceptance and the ability to move forward in spite of its bleakness.
